COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course provides an overview of biblical discipleship and how we should act as disciples in the 21st century, thus proclaiming the good news that Jesus Christ is Lord.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of this course, participants will:

- 1. Possess a broad understanding of biblical discipleship as understood by Christ and His disciples.
- 2. Possess a broad understanding of biblical discipleship as understood by the early church.

- 3. Develop and implement within one's own life what discipleship should be in the 21st century.
- 4. Be able to articulate what discipleship should be in the 21st century to new Christians.

COURSE EVALUATION

- 1. 30% In the Dust of the Rabbi Discover Guide During the week after the presentation of the material in class you will be expected to totally complete the "In Depth Personal Study Sessions" in the "In the Dust of the Rabbi Discovery Guide." These study sessions will assist you in understanding the material that has been presented and prepare you for the coming material to be presented in the next class. This book will be collected during the sixth class for grading. Spot checks will be done through the course to ascertain your accomplishment of the assigned material.
- 2. 30% Walk as Jesus Walked Discover Guide During the week after the presentation of the material in class you will be expected to totally complete the "In Depth Personal Study Sessions" in the "Walk as Jesus Walked Discovery Guide." These study sessions will assist you in understanding the material that has been presented and prepare you for the coming material to be presented in the next class. This book will be collected during the tenth class for grading, which means that during the week prior to the last class you will need to complete the last chapter prior to reviewing the video in the series. Spot checks will be done through the course to ascertain your accomplishment of the assigned material.

3. 20% - Becoming a Disciple Paper

- a) Due Class Six
 - i. Using the information from the Discovery Guide and class discussions describe what "becoming a disciple" should mean in today's environment.
- b) Approx. Time = 5 Hours
- c) The paper will be 2-3 pages of content plus Cover Sheet and Bibliography. Double Spaced, 1" margins, 12 pix. Font. A minimum of three references outside of the Discovery Guides and the Bible are required.

d) Present highlights from your paper in class (three minutes maximum). Do not read the paper.

4. 20% - Making Disciples Paper

- a) Due Class Ten
 - i. Using the information from the Discovery Guide and class discussions describe what is required to "make disciples" in today's environment.
- b) Approx. Time = 10 Hours
- c) The paper will be 3-4 pages of content plus Cover Sheet and Bibliography. Double Spaced, 1" margins, 12 pix. Font. A minimum of four references outside of the Discovery Guides and the Bible are required.
- d) Present highlights from your paper in class (five minutes maximum). Do not read the paper.

Note: All work is expected to be presented with proper grammar, sentence structure, spelling, and punctuation (Turabian Style Guide). All assignments are to be completed and submitted on or before the assigned time. If late, the grade received for them will be no higher than a "B" in accordance with the school catalog.
